Ron Clouzet sends the following report:

The *Prophecies Decoded* meetings (NET 2011) began well, and we have early evidence that God is clearly at work.

- 1. At the Madison Campus Church in Nashville, the live site, there were at total of about 900 people attending both nights, between two sessions each night. At least 350 of them are non-member guests, and 88% of those who attended the first night returned the second night. This morning, after an hour of earnest prayer, the NET team, pastors and seminary students sorted out names for evangelistic visitation.
- The broadcast to over 640 satellite sites went without any reported problems. People were in churches from Ontario to California, Florida to British Columbia, Bermuda, England, and other sites.
- 3. Several college churches are showing the NET meetings. At Andrews, the university church had over 300 attending, and at Southern, they expected only 25 but over 100 showed up, including 30 guests. In both sites, they kept adding chairs because people kept coming.
- 4. Last night, a well-educated and influential lady who'd come to the archaeology and creation meetings, cut short her attendance to a funeral and drove an hour and a half to attend the meeting. "I just could not miss this," she said with a broad smile.
- 5. We received a note from a guest who attended the archaeology meetings who couldn't wait for the NET prophecy meetings to begin. She had decided to start keeping the Sabbath.
- 6. Many have commented on the quality of the meetings and how interesting the topics are. A good number of church members, some multi-generation Adventists, have been surprised they could learn new things about the Bible.
- 7. Pray for those watching via Hope Channel/Direct TV, and that some may seek to connect with a nearby local church. Pray for church members to be revived as a result of these meetings.
